Waving Your Magic Wand to Take Control of Your IHC Controls		
Steve Westra, Stat Labs		
It is essential to run controls in IHC staining experiments to confirm that the observed staining pattern is true, accurate and reliable. The interpretation of IHC and ISH results relies on the use of method controls and a general acceptance of what is considered to be appropriate staining. Control material must be fixed and processed in the same manner as the test material, to assure the accuracy of the results. Tissues with known level of expression of the target are used as controls. Control tissues are used for various purposes in the IHC laboratory. This includes test development, validation and verification. IHC control resources will be provided in this presentation. What are your controls controlling? What are the purposes of internal controls? Good controls and proper use of good controls solve almost all problems in the IHC laboratory. IHC is a challenge, technical complex but not mission impossible if the proper controls are used.
